AT THE TABLE - Radical Ordinary Hospitality - John 4:5-42 TPT

Luke 19:10 NIV For the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost. Luke 7:34 NIV The Son of Man came eating and drinking...

One was Jesus' *mission*; the other was Jesus' *method*.

"Hospitality" Greek = philoxenia; "philo" means <u>love</u>; "xenos" means <u>stranger</u>... foreigner, immigrant, refugee, outsider, guest.

- Romans 12:13 NIV Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality.
- 1 Peter 4:8-10 NIV Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a
 multitude of sins. Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling. Each of you should
 use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in
 its various forms.
- **Hebrews 13:2 NIV** Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it.

Radically ordinary hospitality-those who live it see strangers as neighbors and neighbors as family of God. They recoil at reducing a person to a category or a label. They see God's image reflected in the eyes of every human being on earth... Those who live out radically ordinary hospitality see their homes not as theirs at all but as God's gift to use for the furtherance of his kingdom. They open doors; they seek out the underprivileged. They know that the gospel comes with a house key. - **Rosaria Butterfield**
